Recommended Form for Bibliography:

Author's name (surname, first). Title of book. Place of publication: Publisher, date of publication. Type of binding: simply listing cloth or paper binding is appropriate for most modern books.

It is strongly recommended to give edition information if you have it: for example, first edition, first U.S. or UK edition, limited edition, or reprint. Any additional information such as illustrator, editor, or translator may be included.

Examples:

Bancroft, Hubert Howe. History of Mexico. San Francisco: A. L. Bancroft & Co., 1883 – 1888. Illustrated. Volumes 1 – 6. Contemporary leather binding. First edition.

Doycle, Arthur Conan. His Last Bow. A Reminiscence of Sherlock Holmes. New York: George H. Doran, 1917. First U.S. edition. Cloth.

Duncan, Isadora. The Art of the Dance. New York: Theatre Arts, 1928. Illustrated. First edition: limited memorial edition.

Nebenzahl, Kenneth. Mapping the Silk Road: 2,000 Years of Exploring the East. London: Phaidon, 2004. First edition. Cloth. Copy inscribed by author.

Simon, Maurya. A Brief History of Punctuation: Poems. Winona, Minn.: Sutton Hoo, 2002. Calligraphy by Cheryl Jacobsen. First edition. Paper. One of a limited edition, Signed by the poet and calligrapher.
